Prevention Activities Related to the ACA and Health Reform

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Strategic Initiative #1 Prevention of Substance Abuse and Mental Illness (Vital Few for 2012)

1.1.2 Prevent substance abuse and improve well-being in States, Territories, Tribes, and communities across the Nation

1.1.2.1: Use SAMHSA Block Grant and discretionary funds in conjunction with other Federal prevention programs to build emotional health from early childhood to young adulthood and to implement universal, selective and indicated prevention activities for mental and substance use disorders among the most vulnerable and impoverished in States, Territories, and Tribes and communities.

Prevention Activities Related to the ACA and Health Reform

Strategic Initiative #5-- Health Reform (Vital Few for 2012)

5.4.5 Assist States and Territories to make the best use of Block Grant funds as changes to the Block Grants are implemented.

- Develop the Block Grant application and the PFS II RFA Discretionary Grant.
- Substance Abuse Block Grant --\$344 million for prevention (20% of total award to States)
- PFS II RFA-- Up to \$40 million in awards for PFS II funded from SPF-line
11-18 states will receive funding for 3 years.

Strategic Initiative #5 – Health Reform

Analyze and disseminate Block Grant Addendum information provided by States and Territories.

Train and organize SAMHSA staff to provide targeted technical assistance for States and Territories with Block Grant plans and related transitions resulting from changes to the Block Grants.

Convene State and Territorial representatives related to shared Block Grant issues, including transitions resulting from changes to the Block Grants, services, implementation, and/or reporting.

Prevention Activities Related to the ACA and Health Reform

DCP is responding to community based HIV programs and community based DFC Coalitions with SAMHSA approved presentations when requested.

With the assistance of CADCA, informational presentations have been provided at sponsored conferences related to the implications of the affordable care act for substance abuse prevention.

- The DFC Program has emphasized the importance of Coalition involvement in local planning activities related to ACA activities with an emphasis on the importance of “representing prevention at the table.”

Prevention Activities Related to the ACA and Health Reform

While the major efforts of community anti- drug coalitions remain focused on long term campaigns related to underage drinking, prescription abuse and the impact of other substances on youth, there has been some advocacy at the local level related to such activities as:

- The integration of primary care and behavioral health services
- The development of health homes and the use of screening programs such as SBIRT
- The enrollment of underserved or at risk populations within the ACA Medicaid requirements
- The importance of health promotion in addition to community wide substance abuse prevention efforts related to youth
